Distance Learning Plan

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Distance Learning

In accordance with the Minnesota Department of Education Guidance on Distance Learning Tesfa International School has created the following Distance Learning Plan to ensure that every student at Tesfa International School receives an equitable education and has equal access to appropriate educational learning, materials and instruction during the COVID-19 pandemic.

Tesfa International School will utilize Google Classroom as a primary learning management platform. Students in grades Kindergarten - 2nd grade will also use SeeSaw as a learning management platform.

Teachers will interact on a daily basis with students using Google Meet as a primary format to connect with students. Extensive lesson plans have been developed for the first two weeks of distance learning for each grade and lesson plans for future weeks of distance learning are in various stages of planning and development.

Instructional Materials Pick-up

Distance Learning iPad and materials were distributed on Wednesday the 18th of March and Thursday, March 19. All parents were contacted and asked to sign up for a time slot to come to Tesfa International School to pick up items for distance learning. Times were staggered based on planning for social distancing. Only immediate family members and teachers were permitted to be in the room. In the event that families were unable to pick up items for distance learning, Mr. Jonas delivered those materials, Ipad, and assignments to families over spring break the week of March 23-27. All students had received iPads and learning materials by March 25.

As students and parents picked up materials they were provided training in accessing learning platforms and programs with the expectation that all students and families are fully prepared to access all content on March 30, 2020.

Childcare for Essential Workers

As part of the state's response to the spread of the COVID-19 virus, Governor Walz has directed school districts to provide school age care for children of healthcare and emergency workers. Tesfa was in immediate communications with families inquiring about child care programming for emergency workers. Currently, three families have been identified that meet the criteria and require child care. These students will participate in Distance Learning at Tesfa

while supervised by a Tesfa staff member. The students will be separated into multiple classrooms to maintain social distancing as much as is feasible.

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Nutrition

Each Tesfa family was contacted and asked if they would benefit from food service. 55% of families responded that they would like school breakfasts and lunches delivered to their homes.

These families will have breakfast and lunches delivered directly to their places of residence by one of our contracted service bus drivers.

Health and Wellness

Tesfa will follow the Department of Health's guidelines regarding staff reporting to work, which includes not asking staff to report to work based on higher risk status or other conditions.

Teachers at Tesfa will be addressing concerns over COVID-19 with their students as part of their distance learning plans. Teachers will also be continually communicating with families of their students, through Google Meet, texts and phone calls.. Additionally, office and administrative staff members will be regularly informing families, community members, volunteers, and contractors, about ways to remain safe during this time.

Mental Health Support Resources

Tesfa will promote mental and physical health as outlined by the Minnesota Department of Education. Teachers will closely monitor on-line interactions of students occuring within the learning platforms. Tesfa will address any bullying issues per school policy for both harassment and appropriate use of technology.

Attendance and Truancy

Tesfa will measure attendance by having teachers monitor work completion and contact with students on a daily basis. Attendance will be recorded daily based upon student participation and parents of students that are marked absent will be contacted within 24 hours.

Special Education Services - IEP or 504 Plan

In accordance with Minnesota's Department of Education Distance Teaching and Learning Implementation Guidance document Tesfa International School will follow the Distance Learning Plan to ensure that every student receives an equitable education and has equal access to appropriate educational learning, materials and instruction during the COVID-19 pandemic. Tesfa International School ensures that students with disabilities will continue to receive specialized instruction and related services through a distance learning model to meet their needs as identified in their IEP. The distance learning model includes equitable access to specialized instruction and related services for students with disabilities so that they have access to general education standards and continue to demonstrate progress toward the general education standards and IEP goals. Our distance learning plan will effectively support the unique learning and teaching needs of all of our students, including the ability to provide differentiated instruction as well as one-on-one support for students who need it. Regardless of where the learning is happening, support is identified on our student's Individualized Education Program (IEP) and those supports will continue to be implemented through the distance learning plan by our special education teachers, paraprofessionals, and related service providers. The distance learning plan is secure and will not allow for the release of protected student or staff information.

Tesfa International School has established the following Distance Learning Plan to continue to provide students with disabilities a Free and Appropriate Public Education (FAPE) during the Coronavirus Covid-19 Outbreak. Our planning period began on Friday the 13th of March. During the eight-day school closure, Tesfa International School collaborated with general education teachers, paraprofessionals, parents, Indigo, and related services providers to develop a distance learning delivery model plan that will provide instruction to all students through distance learning. We followed the MDE's Guidance Document process that was described in detail in the Minnesota Department of Education's (MDE's) Guidance Document, available on MDE's COVID-19 Updates webpage. Tesfa International School will have their learning plan completed and posted on the websites by March 30, 2020 https://tesfainternationalschool.org. During the eight-day statewide temporary closure of all public schools, there were no instructional services provided to students.

As part of the eight-day planning period, the special education team planned and addressed different service delivery methods, such as learning platforms and tele-therapy. During the eight-day period, the special education team including paraprofessional and related services

providers, school psychologist were focused on developing Tesfa International School distance learning plan model and taking into consideration the elements set forth in MDE's Guidance

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Document. The eight-day period does not count as a "school day," because students are not receiving instruction during this period. Accordingly, Part B evaluation timelines would not count the eight school day period that schools are temporarily closed in order to develop their distance learning plans. All IEP team meetings were postponed during the planning period. Tesfa International School will conduct all IEP team meetings virtually.

During the planning week, special education teachers and paraprofessionals collaborated on distance learning practices. We provided training to staff, students, and parents/guardians on implementation of the distance learning model and Tesfa's expectations. Additionally, our special educators are working closely with the general education teachers to support general education coursework as well as to schedule direct instruction to meet IEP service minutes.

Due Process: During the eight-day statewide closure Tesfa, focused on determining processes for evaluation timelines in the event of extended school closures due to COVID-19. If this results in the 45 calendar timeline not being met, then the exceptional circumstances language in the Part C regulations would be applicable. **See** 34 C.F.R. § 303.310. There will be no further contact from the special education fiscal monitoring team during the eight-day closure period to provide LEAs with the time to focus on their distance learning plans. During the eight-day closure it is recommended that all LEAs maintain current time and effort processes. IEP teams were not required to meet in person while schools are closed. IEP teams may continue to work with parents and students with disabilities during such school closures and offer advice, as needed. If an evaluation of a student with a disability requires a face-to-face meeting or observation, the evaluation would need to be delayed until school reopens. Evaluations and reevaluations that do not require face-to-face assessments or observations may take place while schools are closed, if the parent consents.

Online Learning Service Delivery Planning

Current Assessment: Special Education Teachers and paraprofessionals have access to MacBooks and Ipads with headphones and the internet that will allow for the distance learning online special services to be delivered. Teachers currently have access to the Google Classroom/Meet online learning platforms. All Special Education team members are required to track services on Sped Forms and will be required to track direct services minutes missed. The amount of additional services required after the break would be determined in a manner similar to calculating the need for compensatory education services or ESY.

Special Education Paraprofessionals: All paraprofessionals have been issued Macbooks with internet access to continue to provide distance learning support to student IEP goals and objectives.

The Minnesota Department of Education has provided the following information in regards to Paraprofessionals work day.

In addition to assisting with staffing your school-age care program for emergency workers and assisting in the delivery/distribution of meals to students, there are many ways to incorporate paraprofessionals into your distance learning planning and programming. Here is a list to help get started

- Organize student work to send home.
- Develop sensory activities that can be done at home.
- Plan movement activities that can be done at home for a break. Create videos to demonstrate.
- Compile a list of online resources that can be sent home to parents in categories to supplement activities (music, reading, movement, etc) for parents needing additional supports.
- Write specific directions for the art projects (aligned with standards) developed by the teacher.
- Create a finished product and take a picture.
- Assist with uploading documents to online platform, if using one.
- Read and record books that will be utilized for courses.
- Read aloud and record any other content that will be used by teachers (tests, worksheets, etc.).
- Daily inspiration, quote, or video to include in correspondence.
- Work with mental health team to provide extra supports and outreach to high-need students.
- Pick a functional skill and teach it. Create instructions (a written version and a picture version) so that teachers can use that to incorporate into other lessons. Record completing that functional skill.
- Create fun activity packets that support the learning standards (word searches, cross words, math sheets, etc.).
- Create mystery reader videos or general story time videos.
- Write notes to be sent home to students so they remember we care, are thinking of them.
- Schedule online meet and greets for check-ins and support learning if questions.
- Spend time learning the technology your school staff is using, help others learn as needed.

Find supports for students to use technology or help with technology work-arounds

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Learning Management Platforms: Tesfa International School will utilize Google Classroom as a Learning Management Platform. Online Meeting Platforms are HIPAA compliant. Google Meet is HIPAA compliant. Google Hangouts chat video is not HIPPA compliant, so we will not utilize it. Related service providers such as Speech/Language and Occupational Therapist will need confidential meeting rooms online to provide services in a tele-services. No special education staff member or direct service provider will be physically in the same location for the provision of specialized instruction or related services.

Related Service Providers: Mr. Alexander Westenbroek (Speech Language Pathologist) and Ms. Stacey DeSouza (Occupational Therapist) are Tesfa International School contracted related service providers. They have access to portable devices and online meeting (Zoom) /learning platforms. If they need other equipment, such as a headset, that will be required to provide the related service they will contact Ms. Jennifer Reeck, Special Education Coordinator asap.

Telepractice: A speech language Pathologist (SLP) must be licensed in both the state where they are located when providing the service and the state where the child is located at the time of service delivery to provide direct services via telepractice for a Minnesota school district. To clarify licensing requirements, SLPs who are licensed by the Minnesota Professional Educator Licensing and Standards Board (PELSB) and will do distance learning with the options outlined in the MDE Guidance do not need a Minnesota Department of Health (MDH) license. They will be utilizing distance learning in conjunction with other school staff and will not be doing telepractice in a health care setting. There is nothing in current Minnesota statute, federal regulations or in ASHA documents that would require SLPs to have their Certificate of Clinical Competence (CCC) for providing speech language pathology services via telepractice.

English Learners

Tesfa International School will be meeting the requirements of English Learners educational needs through distance learning. The EL teachers have partnered with classroom teachers to plan EL supports and instruction. EL teachers will provide options to students for English language development instruction that are additional to mainstream instruction. This additional instruction will provide opportunities for students to grow in their English language proficiency. Language instruction will be aligned to grade level standards.

EL students will have daily contact time with their licensed EL teacher. Student contact time (one-on-one or in a small group) will be used for conferring, providing feedback, setting individual learning goals, and/or checking on progress. This will be done through Google Hangouts or over the phone.

All mainstream teachers will clearly identify how they are providing supports in their distance learning for students identified EL. This will be done in lesson plans and materials. These supports will address all four domains (i.e., reading, writing, listening and speaking), but specifically include plans for scaffolding and providing feedback on student writing and speaking, whenever possible. Expectations for student work will be differentiated based on proficiency level, grade level and personal differences (e.g., background knowledge, home language literacy, interest, individual learning program (IEP), students with limited or interrupted formal education (SLIFE) status, etc.

Students Experiencing Homelessness or Housing Instability

Tesfa currently does not have any students identified as meeting this criteria. However, in the event that change Tesfa will be prepared to transport students to school and/or to deliver materials to a safe location identified as appropriate for the student to continue learning.

Early Learning

Tesfa does not have a prekindergarten program.

Assessment

On March 20, 2020, the Commissioner of Education informed all Minnesota schools that state assessments will not occur for the 2019-2020 school year.

Before and After Care

Tesfa does not provide before or after school care.

Communication

Tesfa has implemented several communication protocols and plans for staff members, students and families, including:

- The Executive Director attends regular conference calls with the Commissioner of Education
- The Executive Director maintains daily contact with the Tesfa authorizer, VOA
- There are frequent updates between the Executive Director and the Tesfa Board Chair
- Administrative and office staff meetings are held daily at 8:30 a.m.
- Robo calls to all families with announced changes
- Website updates
- Flyers sent home with students
- Regular updates on the school Facebook Page

Tribal Consideration

At this time, this component is not applicable to the Tesfa learning community.

Broadband Access

Tesfa called and talked with each family about the status of their access to wifi. Two families identified that they did not currently have access. These families were provided detailed information as to how they could contact Comcast and receive free wifi for at least 60 days. These families were also provided the mobile phone # of the school executive director and

asked to contact him directly for assistance in the event they experienced difficulty accessing the free wifi through Comcast.

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Activities

Tesfa has suspended all in-person school activities, per Emergency Executive Order 20-02.

Staff

Tesfa provided initial training to staff and outlined expectations on March 13th prior to the announcement of closure by the governor. Ongoing planning and preparation took place the week of March 16-20. All paraprofessionals were provided with laptops. As distance learning commences on March 30th, Tesfa staff members will provide training to students and families as needed.

Funding

Tesfa financial and payroll processes are in place and operating smoothly. To date, there has not been an uptick in suspicious vendors or inquiries.

Employment and Workforce

Tesfa is finding, as all Minnesota schools are experiencing, that the guidelines in this area are being frequently updated, and we are following changes as they occur.

Prevention Measures

Tesfa has_implemented numerous measures to protect staff, students and others from the spread of COVID-19 such as:

- Staff members that can work from home will be asked to do so, particularly after distance learning systems and structures are fully operational
- Staff members entering the building will be directed to maintain social distancing boundaries
- Custodial staff disinfect all common areas on a daily basis
- Staff members will disinfect surfaces, door knobs and light switches on a regular basis
- Disinfectant wipes will be at each copier machine
- The entire building was deep cleaned March23-27^h during Spring Break
